

This month's recommendations come from The Friday Afternoon book group.

Maisie Dobbs by Jacqueline Winspear

The first in a series of 17 books (a new and last one, to be published this year). As with all first stories in a series, a lot of the book is building up the characters and the era the stories they are set in. It is well written and engaging and moves along at a good pace. Each book follows a different case, or sometimes a few cases. They are all set in the aftermath of World War I, which I would go so far as to say is the second main character in all the books. Our heroine and her assistant both suffer from the after effects of the war and it plays a large part in the cases also. A mix of history, adventure, mystery and excellent story telling.

Thoroughly recommended but best to read them in order.


