Play area, to help reduce the traffic speeds and warn drivers of pedestrians crossing the road. The Traffic Speed Indicator has been moved to its other location, to help ensure an element of surprise. Tom O'Driscoll continues to monitor the devices.

There has been much correspondence with the local police team regarding speeding traffic etc. The police are adamant that in order for there to be any further assistance, we need to create a new Community Speed Watch group in the village, in order to collate relevant data which will help with the traffic monitoring. They assure us that when this happens, there will be support for the group. Villagers are reminded that any general roadside maintenance issues can be reported directly on the Wiltshire Council MyWiltsapp or via the Wiltshire Council website at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/ mywilts-online-reporting



Two very small and rarely used churches are to be opened for services during August. Chitterne's own Chancel (right) will be used for a service on Saturday 30th August at 4pm. further details will be posted on Petenet.

Rollestone St Andrew (above left and right) will host the Annual Service of Peace on August 24th. (For more detail, see article by Rev. Eleanor on page 3). The classic flint and stone chequer-work church was built mainly in the 13th century and was used by the religious crusading order of the Knights Templar for some 350 years. It's wooden bell turret was added some time in the nineteenth century.

An email about traffic volume and speed from villager Gillian Nolan to Wiltshire Council was discussed. Virginia Neale reported on the continuing danger to residents walking and riding through the village from speeding cars and overweight lorries. Gillian Nolan's letter to the Wiltshire Council produced the usual response: that nothing would be done for villages which did not have a Speedwatch team, and anyway, there was no alternative route for vehicles when the A303 was blocked or congested. A discussion ensued and it was agreed that we need a higher profile if any progress is to be made. Tim Tyler agreed to look into the formation of another Speedwatch team; Clerk will contact the Parish Clerk in Shrewton to see whether a joint approach can be taken; Virginia Neale will continue to try and get a response from Andrew Murrison MP.

#### Banking, assets & finances:

Correspondence:

Treasurer's account, P&L and Balance sheet were updated to 7th July 2025. Bank balance at 1st July 2025 - £11,690.19 Parish Accounts to 30th June 2025 were approved and signed.

#### Reports from Councillors:

**Cllr Horsfall:** Chitterne Brook: MOD deny responsibility for ditches from Middle Barn to Townsend. Wiltshire Council confirm their only responsibility is for the carriageway. The ditches are the responsibility of the adjacent land owner the MOD.

The Parish Steward has been attending to potholes, clearing gullies and weeding at the roadside and along pavements.

A request has been made to Wiltshire Council for the road sweeper to attend to verges on the approach roads into Chitterne and to carry out other minor works / repairs.

Further work to trees on the playing field and other areas will be carried out for two days during August. The MOD have been asked to attend to their trees along the Cut. Brian Lee continues to maintain the playing field and to attend to the footpaths. He will also

be carrying out necessary tidying up work in the

Cut and in the Chalk pit on Back Lane.

Cllr Ricketts: The EWCO (English Woodland Creation Offer) application has been submitted and acknowledged by the Forestry Commission who have requested further information, Tree Warden Aileen Fenlon and Clerk to progress. If successful we shall be spending around £7,500 to purchase trees and ancillary supplies during September. This will be recovered via the Rural Payments Scheme. The clearance of the paddocks and the preparation of new allotments continues. We expect to deliver the Heras fencing to Wilton Round Table next week, and

should receive £500 from them.

Permanent Horse & Pedestrian signs have now been erected at both ends of the village on the B390. The temporary signs have remained to slow traffic down for horses in the road. We also have a new pedestrian sign by the Village Hall Continued Page 4/


