

## A Book of Beginnings by Sally Page

A heartwarming, well written story of a young woman's journey from a dark place in her life to meeting a new group of friends who make her feel life is worth living again. The author explores the value of friendship. She makes you think and question your own attitude to friendship, through wisdom, insight, and sympathetic well-drawn characters in the intriguing background of a stationery shop. Well worth a read.

#### Shackelton by Ralph Fiennes

A masterful biography of a much-underrated explorer. So different to the more famous story of Captain Scott. The book group was surprised to find Shackleton's story gripping. In fact, we all enjoyed it a lot, and were all equally astounded. Ralph Fiennes writing must have been the clue to this successful book.

A must read.


#### WELCOME
